
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



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Principal's Report - Monday, 20/2/23

School Security

School has once again had some signs of people entering the school grounds recently over the holidays. In the final weekend of school holidays, the canteen was broken into with forced entry via the roller door, causing significant damage. The door was pulled of its tracks and has been screwed shut in the short term to secure the door. The canteen was 'trashed' which included throwing eggs at the fan, some stock damaged or missing. The canteen was cleaned initially, then had a second deep clean through the school employing a GA for an additional day.

I have contacted the school security unit and have sort comprehensive advice/ recommendations from the Risk Management Unit. These recommendations have been passed onto our school Assets Officer, which have been endorsed in principle.

A school alarm system was strongly recommended, and assets also would like to consider CCTV. Due to the significant cost, it would have to be an assets funded project.

Wellbeing initiatives

Grow Your Mind

Grow Your Mind Whole School Program

Grow Your Mind is an award winning social and emotional wellbeing program for schools and homes. Grounded in four key pillars of research: positive psychology, public health, social and emotional learning + neuroscience.

Our digital annual subscription is aimed for parents and carers to use as an information bank and inspiration for ideas to spread wellbeing messages at home with children aged 5 through to 12 years of age.

I am very proud to have spent part of our staff development days learning together with our Paterson Community Preschool as we completed the Staff Wellbeing Workshop and delved deeply into the program and the research and evidence base that underpins the program. Learn, live, teach, embed.

Staff at Paterson PS have all completed further professional learning with the Implementation Training and have another follow up workshop with their lead educators to support our own implementation pathway.

Humble Project has begun at Paterson...

Project Humble is a new learning program that I am primarily and initially taught during our RFF (release from face-to-face) lessons. Paterson is 1 of 20 pilot schools partaking in this great initiative. Project Humble is an innovative education program that is all about BEES. The goal of the program is to inspire change while connecting our students with real-world learning tasks that spark their curiosity. It is also about making connections with our community and other schools in achieving collective goals of making our planet a better place to live. We all know the significance of bees and their interconnected relationship with our food and the environment.



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In our first lessons we have been learning about sub-species and choosing a variety for our school—our students debated passionately and then placed their votes. Our students proudly chose the 'Pocket Rocket' specie, also known as the apis mellifera carnica or the Carniolan honeybee. We also brainstormed, short-listed and voted on our final name for our queen... and quite fittingly, it has been named *Queen Patricia*. Watch this space...

Youth Officer

Senior Constable Troy Visintin visiting Paterson PS on March 2nd. His role as a Youth Officer for Port Stephens-Hunter Police District involves implementing strategies to reduce juvenile crime including crime prevention and safety talks in primary schools, juvenile crime reduction programs, networking with other agencies and implementing the Young Offenders Act, 1997.

Sustainability Grant – Partnership with Growing future farmers

I was recently notified that we were successful in being awarded the School Sustainability Grant, which comes to just short of \$15 000. I have started discussion with stakeholders and a timeline of a semester 2 implementation is currently being revisited.

Rationale / Theory of change:

Our school currently has a series of purpose—built vegetable gardens, chickens and a beautiful naturalistic surrounds and spaces. We want to utilise our existing resources/infrastructure and invest in a sustainable education program to upskill -our staff, community and most importantly our students, when in the face of threats to food security—we can be a part of a more sustainable food system.

SeeSaw / Third-Party Online Applications

CONTEXT: The school uses third-party providers offering web-based educational resources and cloud-based storage to support our administrative functions and enhance student learning outcomes. The department has a service agreement with some providers it has assessed as meeting privacy and security standards required of the department. The school offers students access to a number of services in addition to these.

In most instances, students are required to register before accessing an online service. Registration involves either a staff member or student entering identifying information such as name, grade, and email address onto the provider's platform. This and any other data entered in the course of accessing the application may be stored on servers located in Australia or off-shore in a country not subject to NSW privacy laws.

We are wanting to explore the feasibility of continuing to use Seesaw, cost and security are factors in opening this discussion, as well as the option of other applica-

Curriculum Reform



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- English and mathematics syllabuses for years K-2 are now in the implementation phase. All schools can now access comprehensive support packages for English K-2 and Mathematics K-2 syllabuses and resources designed for school leaders.
- English and mathematics syllabuses for years 3-10 are now ready and available on NESA's Digital CurriculumExternal link to help schools begin to plan and prepare for implementation in 2024. Now that these syllabuses have been released, a range of supporting resources are being developed to assist teachers plan and prepare for implementation. NAPLAN

This Year NAPLAN assessments will be held in Term 1 2023 during Weeks 8 to 10 (Wednesday 15 March to Monday 27 March). NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

School Infrastructure and upgrades

Shade structure - Grant application, Commonwealth Schools Upgrade Fund: One of the items on the 'wishlist' is to install large shade areas above silver seats and surrounding area, especially after small timber and metal structure had to be removed late last year. I have

Sewer upgrade: Project has been completed. We noticed some ongoing issues with tanks continuing to fill much faster than usual/expected. Follow up work has been completed and plumbers have been back several times to check and re-check work. Some cisterns were replaced among other work. From external observations the issue seems to have been resolved.

Playground Equipment: Due to policy change, the project had to be handed over to our Assets Team to manage the project. The project is still on track to follow the established timeline with work scheduled to begin at the end of the month.

School beautification project: EduGrafix Creative – apply high quality vinyl wraps to external walls, including bricks. I have contacted other school's who have used this company and they come with glowing recommendations. I have sent measurements and design concepts for initial pricing, and quote







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has been returned at \$27 000. A review of which walls to be covered is going to be investigated before accepting quotes and moving ahead with project. I would like to see a change to plan and have the 'lower walls' covered instead of building walls.

Could this be a joint project with P&C?

Internal Classroom Wall Refurbish: Purchase of acoustic wall linings have been purchased and will be installed towards the end of the month in the 5/6 classroom. We are looking forward to changing the entire feel of the classroom with improved visual and auditory improvements.

We have already received quotes to complete the other permanent classroom spaces, including the K/1 and 1/2.

NOTES from P&C regarding the Principal's Report-

- Can parents attend the information sessions held by the Police Officer? Phil will query and respond.
- Feedback for the parent information sessions was that parents are generally busy, also the late notice does not make it easy to attend, also that fact that once you have several students at the school, this then makes it had to attend to all sessions.
- Some parents liked the way Sally Halliday sent out weekly reports on what the student cohort have been up to.
- The feedback regarding the seesaw app was that generally the parent cohort were happy to see it go and look at using something more engaging and user friendly.
