- For Kindergarten, comments for other learning areas are included within the general comment section.

Key Learning Objectives: In English and mathematics, we have included a selection of key learning objectives to help you better understand what your child is working towards and how they are progressing in these core areas. We believe this added detail supports more meaningful conversations about learning at home.

These updates are part of our ongoing efforts to strengthen the partnership between home and school, and to ensure every family feels informed and confident about their child's learning journey.


